October was a very busy month at the library. All told, the number of regular programs, inhouse and off-site events totalled **26**! Special thanks to Bulkley Valley entomologist **Lynn Westcott** for approaching the library to brainstorm and coordinate the following three events focused on science.

- A Science Communication Workshop: tips and techniques for adults sharing their passion and knowledge for science with children through teaching and volunteering. Sponsored by Scientists & Innovators in the Schools (SIS) and Wetzin'Kwa Community Forest Corporation.
- A non-instructional day Science Extravaganza led by the library's amazing VolunTeens and supported by the Society for Canadian Women in Science & Technology (SCWIST).

- Former Smithers resident Aaron Williams launched his book **Chasing Smoke: A**Wildfire Memoir at the library. <u>70</u> people crammed into the space to listen. The author says he used to come to the Smithers Library in the evenings to work on the book, and the library is mentioned in its pages.
- The Bulkley Valley Genealogical Society held a Genealogy for Beginners workshop at the library. All of the participants loved it and requested more workshops on this topic.
- The **VolunTeens** topped off the month with a truly impressive feat the 2nd. Annual **Haunted Library**. **192 children and parents** dropped by to play Hallowe'en-themed games in the Children's Room or brave a spooky tour of the haunted stacks. All 9 VolunTeens did an absolutely fabulous job, and attendance was up by 62 people over the first year!
