Children's & Teen Programming:

- **Babytime**, **Toddlertime** and **Storytime** continue weekly into December. A number of proud grandparents have joined the Babytime group.
- Teens and 'tweens spent Friday evenings at the library playing Dungeons & Dragons and attending an information session on applying to post-secondary institutions. The teen and 'tween program is funded by the **United Way**, who also funded a Zombie-themed noninstructional day program in October.
