## **Children's & Youth Programming**

- A very special kid visited the library for a **Barnyard Storytime** on March 2. Children had a chance to pet and bottle-feed a real **baby goat** after reading stories about goats. Thanks to our Children & Youth Programmer Sandra for bringing 'Gigi' to the library.
- Thanks to local author Emily Bulmer for volunteering to lead a writing workshop
  for 'tweens and to staff member Melissa Sawatsky, also a writer, for volunteering to
  assist. 14 youth attended and were so enthusiastic that they requested a regular
  Writers' Club at the library. A second workshop will be held in April.
- The United Way of Northern BC continues to fund weekly programming for teens and 'tweens.
- Regular **Babytime**, **Toddlertime**, **Storytime** and **LEGO** programs continue.

## **Outreach, Community Needs Assessments & Partnerships**

- The director was honoured to meet with youth at the **Dze L K'ant Friendship Centre** to discuss the library and her role. The library was invited as part of a series of speakers featuring community leaders.
- Kathy Wilford lead a library tour for a group of youth and teachers from the **iCount school**, describing programs and resources and issuing membership cards.
- The library shared information with other local education and literacy organizations at a **Bulkley Valley Literacy Coalition** meeting.
- The director attended an **SD54 educational forum** about the impact of social media on youth.

#### **After Hours Use**

- **Five exam invigilations** and a **Beekeepers' meeting** were held outside of open hours.
- Wednesday night **Magic: The Gathering** continues to grow. The move to Sunday afternoons has resulted in smaller turnouts for **Smithers Tabletop Gamers**.
- A **Book Club** meets at the library monthly.

## **Reports & Funding**

- Our annual report has been submitted to the Libraries and Literacy branch of the Ministry of Education.
- A grant application for a **Summer Reading Club student** has been submitted to **Canada Summer Jobs**.
- The Town of Smithers' has completed their review of the library's year-end paperwork, reporting a deficit of \$482.74. The annual external audit is nearly finished. This year's deadline for submitting our SOFI to Libraries and Literacy is May 16.
