Children's & Youth Programming

- Regular programs **Babytime, Toddlertime, Storytime**, **LEGO Thursdays** and United Way **Teen Night** are all well-attended.
- Both age groups in the **Bulkley Valley Youth Writers Workshop** series met again on a non-instructional day in early December. **Babytime** and **Toddlertime** programs were held the same morning all before the library opened for regular hours at noon!

Adult/General Audience Events

- Book Lovers' Night Out takes place the first Tuesday of each month at The Alpenhorn with support from Wetzin'Kwa Community Forest Corporation.
- **Positive Living North** marked **World AIDS Day** on December 1 with an informational presentation and discussion at the library on AIDS/HIV.

Community Needs Assessments & Outreach

- The director attended the November 29 **Community Vitality Forum** at the Old Church to hear the public's impressions, hopes and concerns.
- The library has joined the Smithers Bridging Committee. The Committee's mission is as follows:

The Smithers Bridging Committee supports and facilitates the sharing of cultures and the building of lasting relationships. We strive to create a welcoming and inclusive community between aboriginal and non-aboriginal peoples in the Bulkley Valley. We do this through education, partnership, celebration, dialogue and reflection.

Reports & Funding

- The Board presented their **2017 funding request** to Town Council on December 6.
- The **Computer Tutoring** service will be **suspended** from December 20 until January 8 in order to stretch Seabridge Gold's funding through to the beginning of May 2017 when the Town of Smithers' funding begins.
- **Reports** on grants from the **United Way**, **Wetzin'Kwa Community Forest Corporation**, and the **Bulkley Valley Community Foundation** are due in January.
- The Friends of the Smithers Library have submitted a grant application to the Bulkley Valley Community Foundation for five more Tech Kits. The kits were selected based on patron feedback and consultation with the school district. The requested items are a programmable Airblock drone, a programmable ball-shaped robot called a Sphero, two building kits for young children utilising gears, and a virtual reality headset.
