Programming

Reports & Funding

- The library's annual report has been submitted to the Libraries & Literacy branch of the Ministry of Education.
- A \$1,400.00 cheque from The Bulkley Valley Community Foundation (BVCF) has been received for the Tech Kits: Phase Two project. The kits purchased with these funds have been well-used by local families.
 - 2017's BVCF application for five new Tech Kits has been rejected. The library continues to seek funding for a programmable drone and Sphero robot to encourage and support computer coding skills. Both of these items are used as teaching tools at Smithers Secondary School.
- The Friends of the Smithers Library's Canada 150 grant application through the BVCF to assist with this summer's reconciliation event has been rejected. Alternative sources of funding are being pursued.
- The library's 2016 financial records have been examined by the Town and are undergoing their annual audit.
