Programs

Professional Development:

The Association of BC Public Library Directors (ABCPLD) has shifted their annual professional development online this year. Wendy, Melissa and Erin viewed the virtual presentations "Media Relations" and "Advocacy in 2020 & Beyond" which will be particularly useful when the New Library-Gallery Fundraising Committee resumes campaigning. Wendy also viewed "Budgeting Basics", "What Makes a Library Director Effective?", "Working With a Board" and "Managing in Times of Uncertainty" as well as "Workplace Mental Health" from BCLA and the BC Libraries Co-operative and "Facilitating Safer, Braver Inclusive Virtual Spaces" from TechSoup. Sandra viewed the webinar "Little Hands: Signing in Storytime".

Community Partnerships

Melissa created a list of books by Indigenous authors for ages 0-18 for the **Dze L K'ant Friendship Centre**. The Centre posted it on their Facebook page, encouraging people to check them out, and is reading selected titles in online storytimes.

Truth & Reconciliation

The **Northwest Library Federation** (Houston to Prince Rupert) is taking on two Library Technician practicum students to begin **decolonizing the catalogue**. They will recommend changes such as reclassifying certain materials to more culturally appropriate Dewey Decimal numbers (e.g. moving

books on Indian residential schools from Education in the 300s to Canadian History in the 900s), updating subject headings , and adding keywords (such as proper spellings of the names of First Nations).

Health & Safety

The library became very busy with after school visits in early November, necessitating locking the door to stay within maximum occupancy. More signage was created about keeping visits short and the occupancy is once again under control.

All aspects of the current Public Health Orders are being followed by staff and visitors. The library thanks all of our patrons who help keep everyone healthy by wearing masks in the building, sanitizing their hands and staying home when they are not feeling well.
