Kim Stanley Robinson: Imagining a Better Climate Future

October 3 at 6:30 PM

A new virtual series called BC Libraries Present, currently focusing on climate thinkers/writers, featured **"Kim Stanley Robinson: Imagining a Better Climate Future**". Amidst the urgency and anxiety of the climate crisis, speculative fiction can help us find hope by showing what an alternative, better future could look like. In The Ministry for the Future, Kim Stanley Robinson imagines a world ravaged by climate disaster, where humans find ways to change politics, technology, and the economy to win the fight against climate change. Imagining a Better Climate Future is a hopeful conversation about solutions to our most existential dilemma, and how imagining new futures can help us get there. The team behind the Drum Run Adventure Tour hosted a drum circle at the library on Tuesday, October 10th. This tour is a two-part odyssey taking place across British Columbia to raise money and awareness for BC Children's Hospital (BCCH). The drum circles will be hosted in over 25 towns and cities, where community members are invited to join Lyle Povah, Executive Director of the Rhythm of Life Society, for indoor drum circles. The run is a 1,500-kilometre journey that Lyle has embarked on, covering four legs: Vancouver Island, the Highway of Tears, the Okanagan and the Lower Mainland.
