June Circulations: **8,327** including 2,155 eltems July Circulations: **10,340** including 2,458 eltems

Our little library had <u>10,340</u> circulations in July! That's a <u>LOT</u> of customer service, interlibrary loans and shelving. If every item cost \$20, that would be <u>\$206,800.00</u> worth of materials that community members used for free in one month.

As busy as we are in the building, there's even more library usage happening that we don't see: July's circulation total includes **2,458** eBooks, eAudiobooks and eMagazines.

Technology

A grateful patron expressed her appreciation after **using library equipment to view her husband's MRI**. It was provided to her on a DVD and she did not own any devices capable of playing it.

A parent asked for help teaching her school-aged daughter to pronounce the sounds of letters. Library staff demonstrated the **early literacy apps** Endless Reader and Endless Alphabet, available on the library's iPads.

Programs, Events & Outreach


Sandra and Jessica entertained **115 children and caregivers** at the **Show 'N' Shine** and registered kids for the Summer Reading Club.






Building

The library's **kitchen floor was replaced** in July. An **outdoor ramp** will be built the week of September 16th to make the library's **emergency exit** by the parking lot **accessible**. All of these building improvements are being funded through our **provincial Enhancement Grant** received in 2023.

Grounds

Another fire occurred in the encampment beside the library on August 5 while the library was closed for the BC Day holiday. No one was injured, but two tents were destroyed and three more were damaged.



<u>Funding</u>

The Library received our 2024 **provincial grant** letter at the end of June, outlining the usual annual grants for public libraries from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs: Per Capita Operating Grant (\$26,592), Resource Sharing Grant (\$5,194.56), BC OneCard Grant (\$10,250), and Literacy and Equity Grant (\$18,000). The province added a one-time \$10,887.04 Library Enhancement Grant which will be spent in 2024 on books, extra copies of e- and eAudiobooks, mugs for events, and replacing outdated staff computers. The grant monies, totalling \$70,923.60, should arrive shortly.

Staff & Training

We bid farewell to staff members **Reuben Bruintjes** and **Jessica Generoux**.

Staff attended **online training** on **homelessness and housing**, the BC Office of the Human Rights Commissioner's **Hate to Hope** program, creating **autistic-friendly libraries**, **legal advice** for public libraries regarding intellectual freedom-related issues, **accessible customer service**, and the **National Network for Equitable Library Service** (services for print-disabled patrons).
