



Where's Lynnda the Librarian? She has gone missing. Older kids and teens heard her spine-tingling story while being guided through the haunted aisles.







Overdose Response Training | Wed, Oct 30, 7:00 p.m.

How can I tell if someone is experiencing an overdose? What can I do to help? This free presentation gave attendees a brief overview of the various types of street drugs in our community, their effects, and how to safely identify and respond to an overdose. It included an interactive workshop on how to safely administer Naloxone—a medication used to reverse the effects of an opioid overdose.
